

Traditional Chinese Veterinary Medicine, Tui-Na, Herbal and Food Therapy For Animals

This course introduces different traditional Chinese veterinary medicine (TCVM) modalities so owners can be familiar with how their pets may be cared for by veterinarians trained in holistic approaches. In the first lecture the speaker will present several different holistic modalities including three case studies. The second lecture will discuss what kinds of diseases and injuries TCVM can address. The third lecture will be a discussion and demonstration of Tui-na for animals using a stuffed toy dog.
